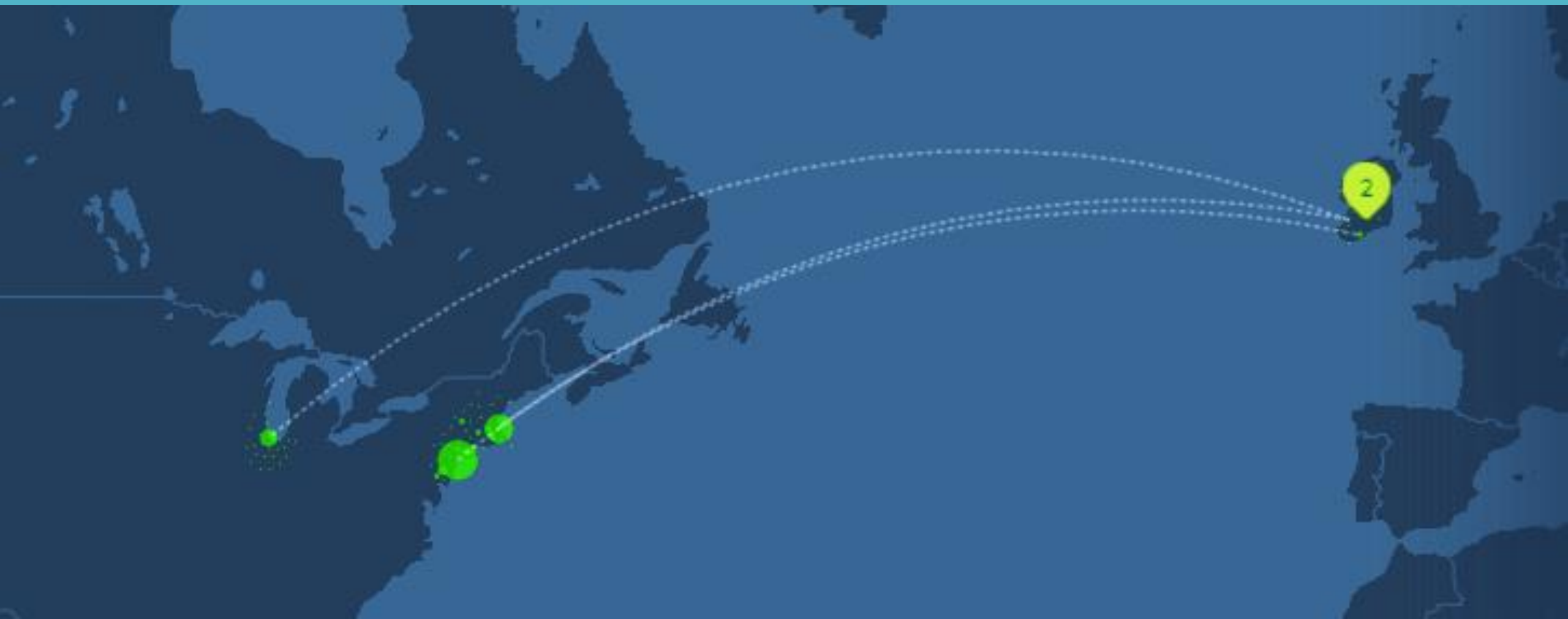


Joining the dots: strategies for finding Irish families through North American and New Zealand records



Why should we look at these records?

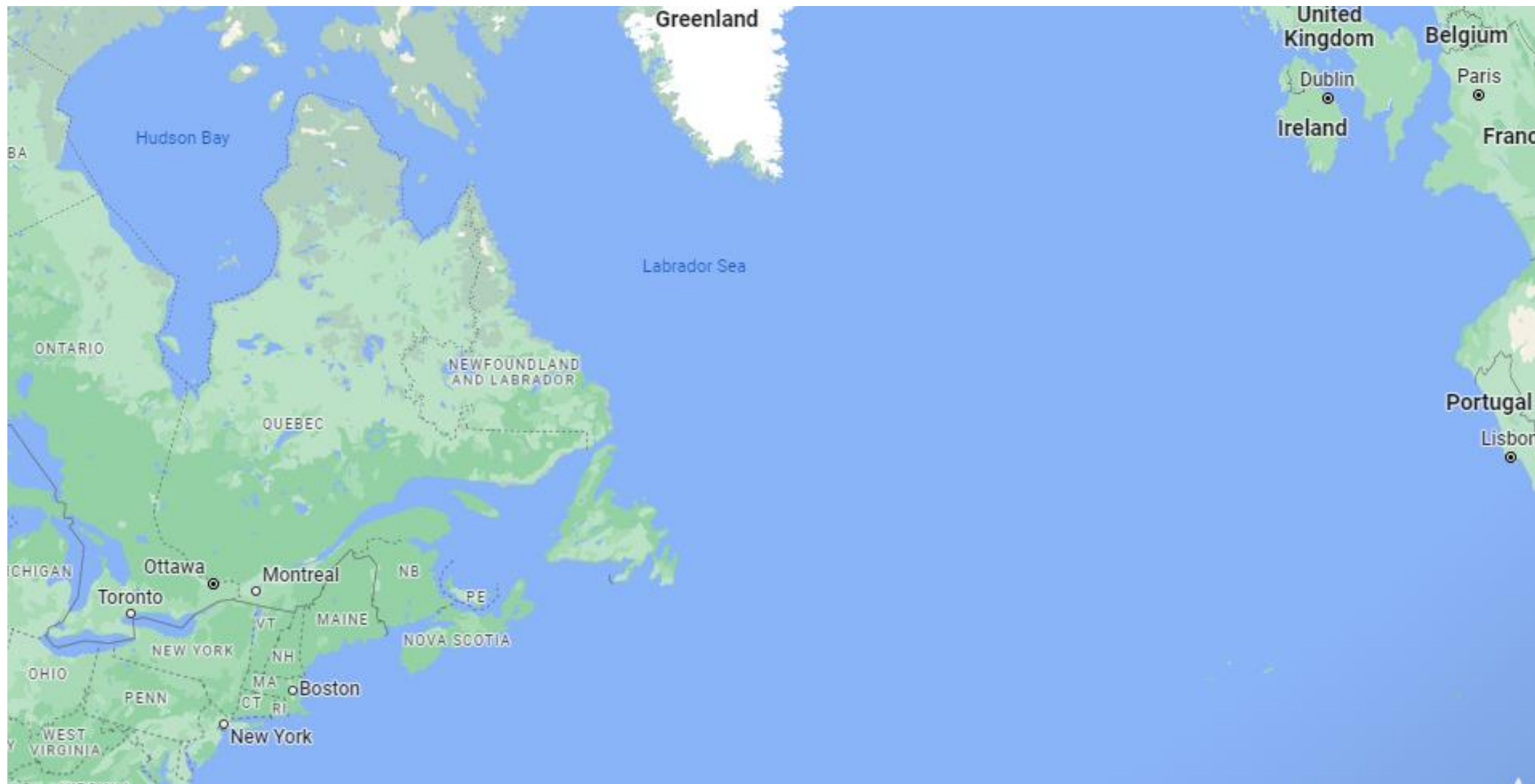
Of all the immigrants to the US between 1851 and 1860, it is estimated that 81 per cent were Irish. Today one sixth of US citizens (43 million) identify having Irish background.

The peak of Irish emigration resulted from the Great Famine of 1845-1852. It has been estimated that nearly two million people - about a quarter of the population - emigrated to the United States in a ten-year period at that time.

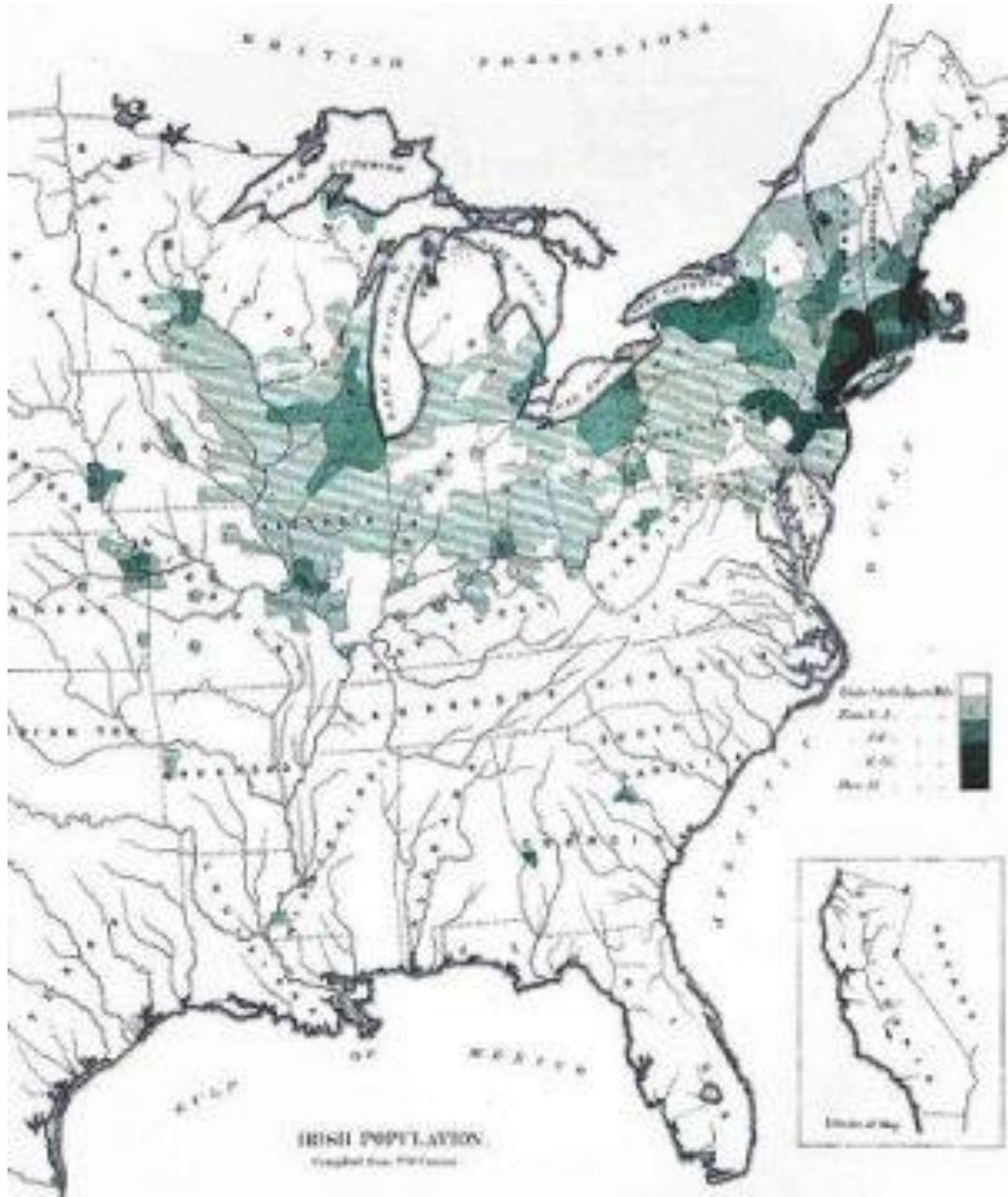
Between 1831 and 1850 over 600,000 Irish migrated to Canada and by 1867 they were the second largest ethnic group (after the French) – 24% of Canada's population.



Cobh (Queenstown) was one of the departure ports for over 2.5 million people.



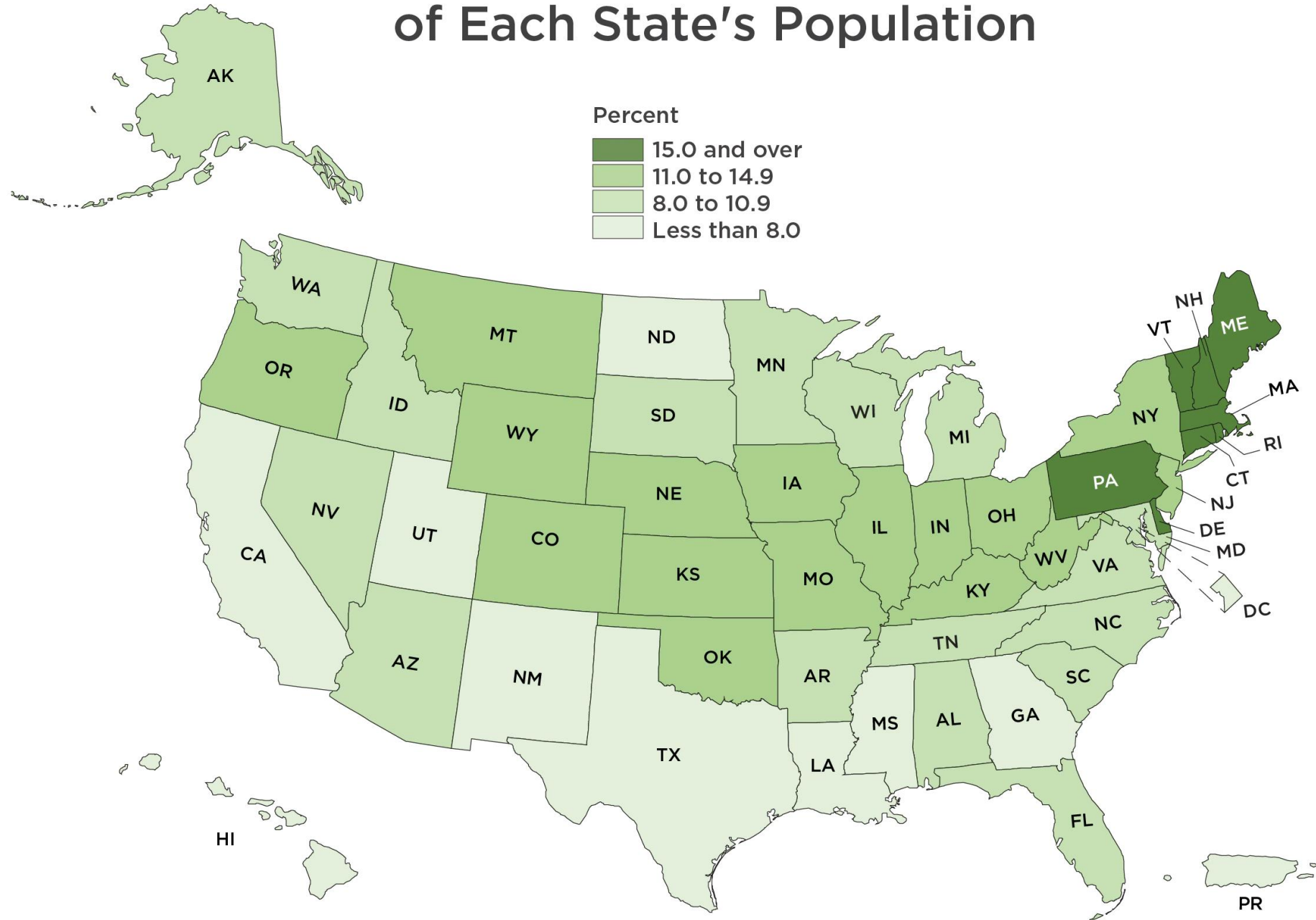

Concentration of Irish-born from 1890 US census.



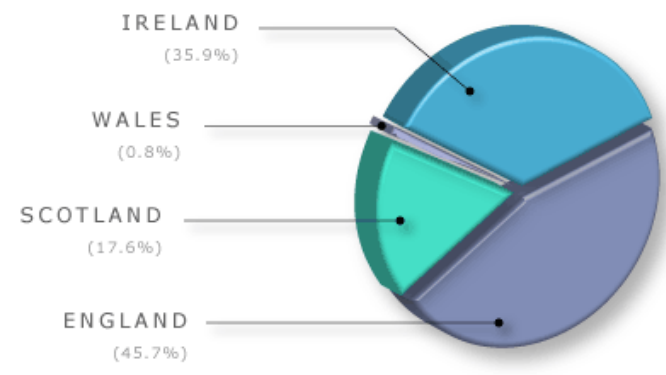
Irish Ancestry as a Percentage of Each State's Population



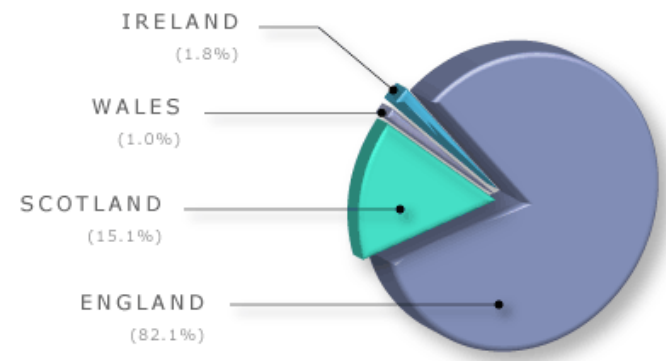

1890 Census was destroyed by a fire at the Commerce Department in Washington, DC on 10 January 1921. The records of only 6,160 of the 106,021,537 people enumerated survived the fire.

American Civil War

12 April 1861 – 9 April 1865

Irish immigrants settled primarily in the northern states and thus tended to fight on the side of the Union. It is estimated that over 150,000 Irish Americans fought in the war.

However, there were a number of Irish brigades in the Confederate forces.

1900 Census lists useful personal information: month and year of birth, how many years married, how many children, and how many of those children are living.

Useful tips when looking at information in a US census.

- *Check if a couple married in Ireland before arriving in the US. This can often be surmised if any of their children were born in Ireland – you can then check the Irish civil records for the marriage and birth if either event was after 1864 or church records if before.*
- *Check if someone is listed as Naturalised. It may be possible to find their naturalisation record.*

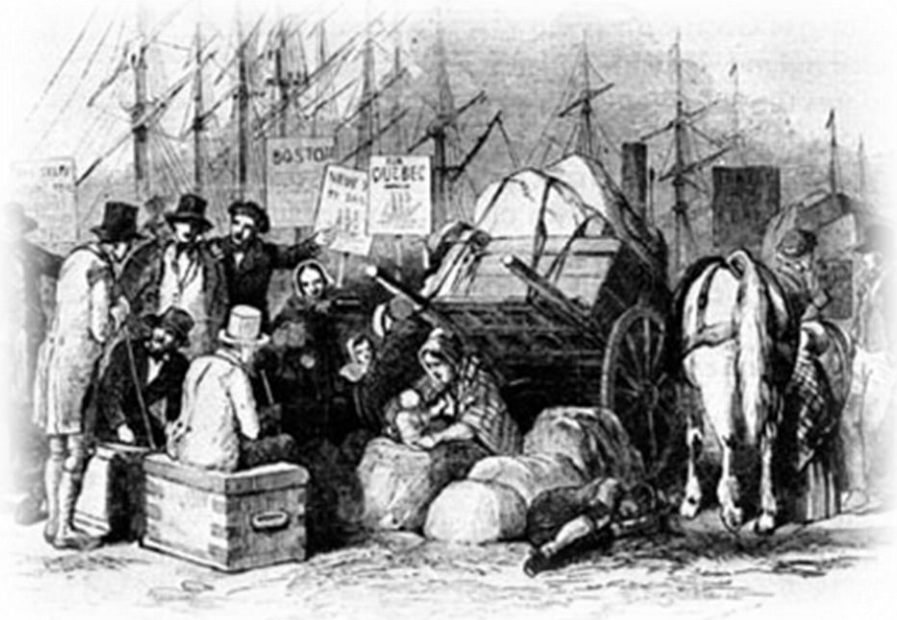
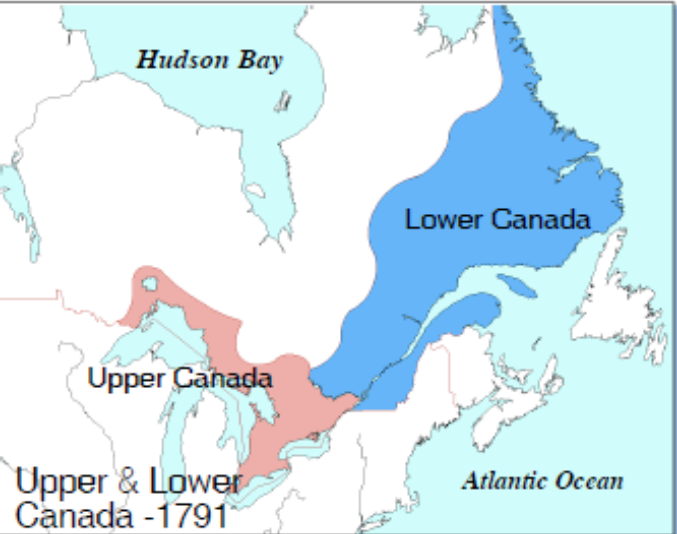

Canada records



Upper Canada is so called as the name reflects its geographic position along the Great Lakes, in relation to the headwaters of the Saint Lawrence River, contrasted with Lower Canada (present-day Quebec) to the northeast.

The Province of Canada was made up of **Canada West (formerly Upper Canada)** and **Canada East (formerly Lower Canada)**. The two regions were governed jointly until the Province was dissolved to make way for Confederation in 1867. Canada West then became Ontario and Canada East became Quebec.

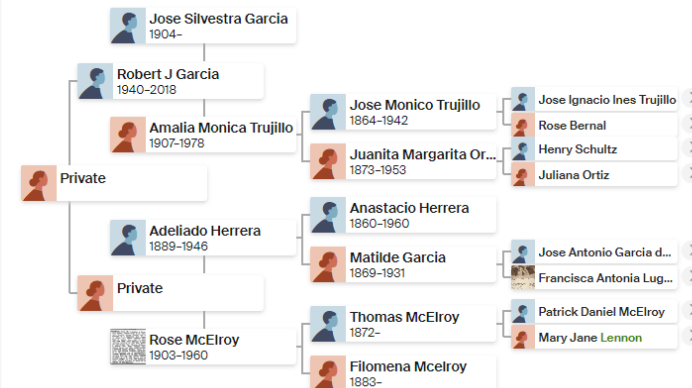

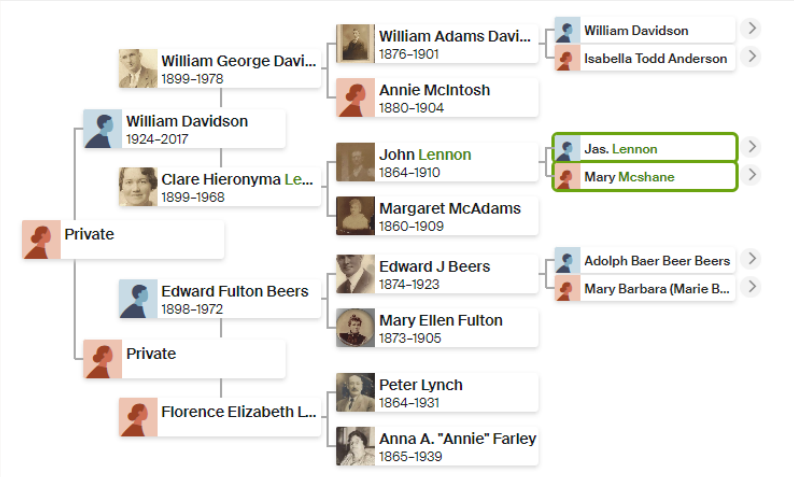
